#### PROPOSED INCREASE TO SUPPORT A "GRANDMA FOR JESUS" STARTING IN JANUARY

For several months the Board has thoughtfully debated the growing need for our "Grandmas for Jesus" to receive more support each month than the current sponsorship amount of \$35 provides. We are proposing an increase of \$5 per month, bringing the Grandma sponsorship amount to \$40 beginning in January.

There are two reasons why the Grandmas need this additional help. As mentioned elsewhere in the newsletter, the cost of food is astronomical in Uganda right now. The Grandmas are seriously struggling to take care of their basic needs. Also, the cost of their health care insurance is not covering the actual costs of their medical care, so we are needing to increase the amount of money available to continue this important benefit as well.

If increasing the cost of sponsorship is a hardship on anyone who is currently sponsoring a Grandma, please contact the ChristAid office. If you are comfortable to begin sending \$40 per month beginning in January, please make arrangements to add the extra \$5 to your monthly gift. God bless you for your love of our sometimes weak and vulnerable Grandmas.

# SPONSORSHIPS OF GRANDMAS AND SCHOOL STUDENTS (AHADI KIDS) ARE THE BACKBONE OF CHRISTAID



<u>Esther Kyamagero</u>, whose birthdate is not known for sure, is about five years old and is in the Preschool "middle" class. This sweet girl lives with her three brothers and her mother who has been left to provide for her family by herself. Her mother does peasant farming to raise food for the kids and to earn money for only their most basic needs.

Her mom has failed to raise school fees, so Esther has had to leave school, which she loves so much. She is broken hearted as she wants to be a nurse someday! She loves the "story-telling" at school and is a good student. Her job at home is to carry water in jugs from the nearby spring.

Her school fees are \$40 per month. If this situation tugs at your heart, read the details below about how to be a loving sponsor to Esther!

<u>Ivory Tumusiime</u> is a Preschool student who is in serious need of love and sponsorship! His single mother is often at the school pleading for a grace period to keep him in school even though she is unable to pay the fees. <u>She understands</u> that without an education his life will be a difficult struggle.

Ivory has managed to progress from the "baby class" at the Preschool into the "middle" class but will not be able to continue his learning without help from a sponsor. Please read below how a \$40 a month sponsorship can transform his life. (He also loves the story telling at the Preschool.)

Besides having the loving support of a Christian teacher, the sponsored students receive a uniform, a daily lunch, and their learning materials. Access to the playground is also a big hit!

<u>Grandma Zoromina Kabasomi</u> shown at right, is 81 years old and lives near the new "Grandma Village" in the district called Gweri. She is weak and struggling to feed herself and her 12-year-old grandson who lives with her. They try to find work digging in other people's gardens in the hope that they will receive payment in food, so they can survive. It is not surprising that Grandma has ulcers and high blood pressure. <u>A sponsorship would mean the world to her!</u>

The cost of sponsorship \$40 per month would provide her with healthcare and money to purchase food staples and other basic needs.

## A BIG THANK YOU TO ALL WHO ATTENDED OUR 2022 FALL FUNDRAISER BANQUET LAST SEPTEMBER

Our Fall Fundraiser banquet was very successful in raising funds for the Secondary School including the funds to complete the new housing units for our headmasters (Richard and William), and to secure funds to remodel their current living spaces into additional classrooms for the new Secondary school. These two construction projects are well underway and will be functional when the new school term starts, approximately February  $6^{TH}$ .

We also raised the funds to send over teacher salaries for the Secondary school for a four-month period while the school adjusted its budget to compensate for devastatingly high food costs to feed our boarding students. The cost of food in Uganda is an extremely serious problem throughout the country, with the war in Ukraine affecting the ability to import needed food items. It has been a huge blessing to the school to have this additional salary support in its first year of operation. Like in any other "business", the first year is tough going!

Together we have assisted approximately 145 Grandmas with daily living expenses and health care. We have blessed 160 school kids to a better life through Christian education and have continued to build Grandma houses, complete the Grandma Village, and made notable progress on the Office Project to provide self-sustainability for ChristAid.
